Parking on Hartsbourne Road

We appreciate that drop off and pick up are busy times but there are plenty of safe spaces a little bit further down the road. We urge everyone to park responsibly and prioritise the safety of our children and the community.

Year 2 – Emilia and Florence are both wonderful learning partners, who are always supportive and work well with a range of different partners.


Year 3 – Rachel and Emily are great learning partners and will always be supportive, regardless of who they work with.

Year 2 & 4 Managing Emotions Project

We have been lucky enough to be selected to participate in the NHS pilot project for supporting mental health in schools. Our qualified Emotional and Mental Health practitioner (EMHP) has been working in our school weekly, running a variety of individual, small group and whole class sessions to support our children.

We have selected Year 2 & Year 4 to receive one of the workshops, you can find more information here. The workshops will be weekly and will start after half term and last for 6 weeks.
