A Note from Mrs Harte

Sports Day

I would like to take this opportunity to say thank you for your support on our recent sports day. Your encouragement was a great source of motivation for our children. We really enjoyed Sports Day and have already thought about how we can improve the format for next year. I am pleased to announce that the winner was Fallow with 180 points, closely followed by Sika with 173, Muntjac with 172 and Roe with 169. We hope that you enjoyed the day as much as we did!

Changes to School Hours

In line with the DFE changes to statutory school hours, we are changing the hours of the school day. This will come into effect from the start of the next academic year. The new timings will be **8:45am to 3:15pm for all year groups**. We will still have the soft start, but please note classroom doors will close promptly at **8.55am**. Unfortunately this year we have experienced a lot of children regularly being picked up late, sometimes as late as 4pm. Our after school schedule for staff varies and we cannot always guarantee that there will be an adult around to look after your children. We completely understand that sometimes emergencies happen and this is unavoidable and will of course support parents with this. However if your child is **regularly** late to be picked up we will be looking at introducing late pick up fees.

Extracurricular Clubs

I have had a few conversations with parents recently about the number of extracurricular clubs that we offer and I am aware that parents would like us to increase these. As a small school we are very limited for space for after school clubs and our hall has been in use for 4 out of the 5 days which limits the range and number of clubs that we can offer. We are looking at increasing the range of clubs, particularly for KSI children. Skill 7 have agreed to run a KSI Multi Sports Club on a Tuesday and we are aiming to introduce a life skills, newspaper and home work club from September, further details to follow. We are aware of the limitations of our space and to combat this we do offer free lunchtime sports clubs provided by Premier Sports coaches 3 days a week and Yoga and French Club over lunchtimes. We are also looking at creative ways that we can offer a daily after school club to provide wraparound care.

End of Term

It is hard to believe that the end of term is nearly here. I would like to take this opportunity to express my heartfelt thanks for your support throughout the year. Your support has come in many forms, from attending Parents Evening and school events, to volunteering your time and resources to support our school community and the wonderful events put on by the Friends of Hartsbourne. We are proud of the progress that our children have made this year, and we know that this would not have been possible without your support.


Our KS2 French Mini Olympics team who came first in the cross primary school competition.

We have lots of activities across the summer as well as our usual books and magazines. Here are a few suggestions that I think might interest you:

The Summer Reading Challenge starts on Saturday 8th July and runs throughout the holidays until Saturday 2nd September. This is a fun, free activity that children of all ages can enjoy. We are challenging children to read 6 library books during the summer and in return we will give them rewards. Anyone who reads all 6 books will be given a certificate and special medal.
