Year 1 – Well done to Malachy for giving things a go this week and Ruby for being supportive and a good friend..


Year 2 - Madeleine for always being supportive and kind to her peers and to Blake who always tries his best and always has a go at all challenges.

Year 6 –Amelie has bravely demonstrated her willingness to attempt a variety of different challenges and Khaden supports people around him when they need help..



Hartsbourne Reading Journey

At Hartsbourne Primary school we value reading as one of the most important skills that your child can learn. Reading opens up the doors to all of the other subjects and it is proven that children who enjoy reading achieve well throughout the whole of their education. With this in mind we are launching a new whole school reading initiative to promote reading for pleasure to your children.

Designed by our fabulous in house artist, Miss Fitzgerald, every child will be given a reading treasure map to help them on their reading journey. Each map will be tailored to your child's year group and will contain 15 recommended books for your child to read over the course of the year. The books have been carefully selected to provide children with a range of texts from non-fiction to poetry. There are some classic books as well as more contemporary choices and we have tried to choose a diverse range of authors.

All children are at a different level in their reading no matter which year group they are in and this challenge can be completed whether they read it themselves or with someone else.

Once they have completed a book, a parent or carer needs to sign the box and the child brings the map back to school where it will be stamped with a special reading journey stamp. Each year as your child completes their map, they will be given an achievement badge in assembly and if they are with us from Reception to Year 6, they will be able to collect them all and will have read 105 high quality texts!

We will be promoting this to the children next week, just in time for Christmas present lists! We hope you will support our new initiative to help all of our children at Hartsbourne enjoy reading.

Forest School

A message from Mrs Gunatissa.



It has been a pleasure to meet all the children and get to know them and I look forward to our forthcoming sessions.

The children will be going into the nature reserve in all weather conditions and below you can find recommended items of clothing for Forest School sessions.

And as winter approaches, the weather is progressively getting colder and wetter, so it is important that your child has appropriate clothing for their Forest School session to stay warm and comfortable.

- Wellies or old shoes
- A top with long sleeves to prevent scratches/stings School jumpers are fine, however they may get muddy.
- Trousers/joggers/leggings If they are wearing shorts or a skirt. School trousers can be worn, again, they may get wet/muddy.
- A waterproof jacket
- The general rule in winter is to wear layers which keep in the heat and can be removed if needed. Children may also need: warm hat, gloves, warm socks.

Forest School is a child-centred inspirational learning process that offers opportunities for holistic growth through regular sessions. It is a long-term program that supports play, exploration and supported risk taking. It develops confidence and self-esteem through learner inspired, hands-on experiences in a natural setting.

Covid - A Message from Hertfordshire

Common Symptoms

The main symptoms of COVID-19 are:

- a high temperature
- a new, continuous cough this means coughing a lot, for more than an hour, or 3 or more coughing episodes in 24 hours
- •a loss or change to sense of smell or taste this means they cannot smell or taste anything, or things smell or taste different to normal

What to do if you or your child has symptoms

If your child has any of the main symptoms of COVID-19, even if they're mild:

- 1. Get a PCR test (test that is sent to a lab) as soon as possible: Get a PCR test to check for COVID-19 on GOV.UK
- 2. Your child should stay at home and not have visitors (self-isolate) until you get a negative test result they can only leave home to have the test. Check if you and anyone else your child lives with need to self-isolate. Check if you and anyone else your child lives with need to self-isolate

Contact Tracing

If a child tests positive for COVID-19, NHS Test and Trace will now contact close contacts directly, replacing communications from the school. Please engage with NHS Test and Trace if they contact you about your child, you will not be contacted or advised by the school about what steps you need to take.

Local Outbreak

If a school or setting has an outbreak there may be further local measures, such asasking siblings of a positive case to isolate and daily testing for secondary school students, that your child may be asked to take. Your child's nursery, school or college will contact you directly in these instances. These additional measures will be required until the end of term and will be regularly reviewed every two weeks. If there is a reduction in case rates of COVID-19, these recommendations may be lifted.
