This will take us a big step closer to being able to complete it. Thank you also to Mrs Hill who made us aware of this scheme so that we could apply. We are able to provide our theme week opportunities for the children due to grants and project funds that we are constantly applying for to supplement our school budget. If you become aware of any that might be appropriate, please do forward them to us.

This week some of the children have been taking part in Road Safety initiatives with Hertfordshire county council. Over the course of the year we will also be having Bikeability training for Year 6 and Scooter training for Year 2. Please help us to teach the children about safety on the roads by driving responsibly at drop off and pick up time and not parking on the zig zag lines outside the school. It is everyone's responsibility to set a good example for all of the children.

We have been informed by HR that as the extra bank holiday falls within the half term, we need to put in a bank holiday for school staff. As we did not know about this when we set our term dates, we have decided to have it on Monday 6th June which is the Monday after May half term. We hope this gives you adequate time to arrange child care and will not cause too much inconvenience as it is tagged on to the end of half term.

As I am sure you are aware we have high cases of Covid and have had to 'zone' our reception class. Please help us to contain the spread of infection in all classes by testing your children when they have symptoms and keeping them at home if they are positive. Year 1 – Dominic has shown amazing concentration this week and contributed well to lessons, and Zainab has shown amazing listening skills in maths this week!


Year 2 – Johnny and maintained good focus and stayed on task this week and Lyla showed good listening skills when peers and adults offer feedback on her work!

Year 4 – Daniel listens and follows instructions beautifully in swimming lessons and Elwood maintains focus and ignores distractions in busy learning environments


Year 5 – Amelia has shown laser focus on her work, stayed on task all week, and Alec had excellent concentration when adding nuance and description to his writing!

Reading Update


