We have all agreed that if we are addressing any questions in KS2, all staff will use Newsround as an appropriate source. As a staff team, our thoughts are with everyone affected by this.

Parents evening is around the corner and we had originally planned for this to be face to face. However with our current staffing situation and rising Covid levels in hertsmere we have made the unwelcome decision to once again hold virtual meetings. We are very aware that parents will want to see their children's book and are planning ways to facilitate this in the first half of the Summer term. Details of parents evening appointments will be sent out next week.

We would like to thank Tesco's in Watford for their kind donation of toys for the children and £500 towards our outdoor library fund. We have now begun to source quotes for this project and are all very excited, thank you for your generosity and support of Friends of Hartsbourne fundraisers that have allowed this to happen. Year 1 – Makenzie has shown the courage to work more independently and Maliha resolves problems sensibly and fairly.


Year 2 – Oscar and Oliver are both independent in their learning and responsible members of their year group.





