HERTSMERE ANNUAL YOUTH CONFERENCE

On Thursday 5th March the Year 6 school councillors and house captains were fortunate enough to attend the 13th Hertsmere Annual Youth Conference, held in the Civic Centre in Borehamwood.

Sat in the plush surroundings of the central council chamber, the children were welcomed by Councillor Caroline Clapper and watched a video all about the work that is done by Hertsmere Borough Council. We were then introduced to Tiernon and Tatton from SimplePolitics.co.uk, whose interactive theatre show 'How Does This Politics Thing Work Then?' gave a great example of how complex the issues faced by politicians at all levels are, and why it is so important to allow everyone to give their opinion about important issues through democratic processes.

The children were able to debate, stand for election and cast their votes on a range of issues, and were reminded that politicians in opposing parties are simply people with different ideas about how to solve the same problems.

We also met Councillors David Carter and Lucy Selby, who answered lots of questions about their roles, including whether or not they had met Boris Johnson (not yet) and who the most famous person they HAD met was (Tom Cruise!)

The whole day was an excellent opportunity to learn about the work of local councils and their responsibilities to the community in which the children live, as well as the wider responsibility of politicians on a national scale. We would like to thank everyone at Hertsmere Borough Council and SimplePolitics for a thought-provoking and well-organised morning.

SCHOOL ACCESS

Please do not walk through the car park and use the side emergency access gates to get to your child's classroom. It is just as quick to use the lower gate on Hartsbourne Road and walk down the zig zag path. Children cannot tell when a car may be pulling out and bins may be collected, and visibility for drivers here is difficult.

I appreciate you could walk through the deck in front of the Portacabin but this is a very busy area being used by our Breakfast Club and having it used as a 'cut through' by parents and other children is frustrating for the Club and distracting for children.

Pearl

Can maintain good focus, stay on-task, ignore distractions, good listening skills for peers and adults.

Topaz

Brave enough to have-a-go, willing to take a chance on being wrong, kind and supportive if others are wrong.

Amethyst

Comfortable with mistakes; can learn from them and bounce back. Can keep calm even when upset.

Ruby

Can support others with friendliness, smiling and good listening, give praise appropriately and help others with a problem.

Sapphire

Can collaborate with others in group work, take turns, share ideas. Listen to the ideas of others and accepts challenges/changes.

Emerald

Co-operate with different partners on a 1:1 basis and show good listening and talking skills. Take turns and co-operate to develop learning and ideas.

Diamond

Being independent and responsible by solving own problems, using different learning strategies and building on previous knowledge. Can identify next steps in learning.

BEFORE SCHOOL

Please can I remind you that children should wait quietly with their adult before school and not run around in the playgrounds, on banks, in the astro turf or using the play equipment. The morning playground is too busy with others for children to be able to play safely at this time. It is so much better if they enter the classroom calm and ready to learn.

Year 3 parents should wait at the bottom of the steps (on the KS2 playground) and Year 4 should wait near the emergency gates. This helps to keep the paths free for parents with prams and pushchairs.
