To stay at home and to protect


The vulnerable who we can still connect









Jack wrote two poems, and Aimee wrote a story.



I was in a time of darkness that day, And somehow it made everything feel okay.


A brightness in a sea of dark.






Louisa's tiger, drawn using a grid.
