SCHOOL SYSTEMS

Please avoid entering the school playground via the deck to the Portacabin. Too many children are walking down through the cars that are trying to park. The exception is for children who use walking aids only as their parents are permitted to use the disabled bay. Please be aware that the disabled parking bay is for members of staff and children with a Blue Badge only.

When a car is leaving school premises please do not walk in front of the sensors and out through the double gates. This causes the gates to close and is dangerous practice when cars are trying to leave. Please use the pedestrian gates only.

HERTFORDSHIRE LIBRARIES

Hertfordshire Libraries offers online access to Britannica Online ie: the equivalent of the printed version of Encyclopedia Britannica. It can be accessed online via the internet and as a member of Hertfordshire Libraries anyone is entitled to use this resource for free, all you need to do is log on with your library card number: http://www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/orlib Or, download the Hertfordshire Libraries App go to Online Resources, follow the link for General Resources then click the link for Britannica Online and log in.

There are three levels of use, one for Junior (for age 6-10), one for Students (for age 10-15) as well as one for Adults (aged 15+). It's a great resource to use with your child for their homework or just to discover the world together. The really good thing about using Britannica Online is you can rest assured there is no fake news! Discover encyclopedia articles, multimedia, primary sources, e-books and other resources that support student research and reinforce curriculum standards.

CLASS CODE: READY, RESPECTFUL, SAFE

Teachers will be teaching children these learning behaviours, alongside our learning gems.

Please talk to your child about these four rules and what they mean for us all. They are designed to ensure we are all safe and able to build good memories of school.

Other changes are:

- A class recognition board for children who are demonstrating the wanted behaviour (eg good concentration).
- Increase in positive, specific praise for all pupils.
- Postcard/note/e mail home for proud moments and other success.
- Whole-class reward system (eg marbles in a jar) as well as House Points.

Consequences are Implemented Through Stepped Boundaries:

- Rule reminder, positive praise for co-operation.
- Rule reminder with warning of consequences (eg sitting in the 'calm zone'.
- Conversation with an adult at breaktime to discuss and establish the correct behaviour.

Once parents are informed of a difficulty and/or incident:

- Use of a behaviour chart, behaviour record sheet.
- Reduced time on playground, astro-turf, withholding a privilege (eg school trip).
- Home/school book/weekly e mails.
- Formal behaviour plan, risk assessment.
- Local authority exclusion procedures.

SCHOOL SYSTEMS

The gates are open from 8.30am, children can enter the school building from 8.45am to 8.55am. Please drop older siblings at their class first and then drop younger ones.

At 3.20pm please do the reverse: collect younger children first and then walk round to collect the older children.

These systems are designed to reduce pinch-points around the school, for example the number of older children waiting under the Reception canopy; they are inclined to get restless and start chasing games up and down the banks.

HARTSBOURNE PRIMARY SCHOOL LEARNING TO LEARN GEMS



Pearl

Can maintain good focus, stay on-task, ignore distractions, good listening skills for peers and adults.

Topaz

Brave enough to have-a-go, willing to take a chance on being wrong, kind and supportive if others are wrong.

Amethyst

Comfortable with mistakes; can learn from them and bounce back. Can keep calm even when upset.

Ruby

Can support others with friendliness, smiling and good listening, give praise appropriately and help others with a problem.

Sapphire

Can collaborate with others in group work, take turns, share ideas. Listen to the ideas of others and accepts challenges/changes.

Emerald

Co-operate with different partners on a 1:1 basis and show good listening and talking skills. Take turns and co-operate to develop learning and ideas.

Diamond

Being independent and responsible by solving own problems, using different learning strategies and building on previous knowledge. Can identify next steps in learning.

BEFORE SCHOOL

Please can I remind you that children should wait quietly with their adult before school and not run around in the playgrounds, on banks, in the astro turf or using the play equipment. The morning playground is too busy with others for children to be able to play safely at this time. It is so much better if they enter the classroom calm and ready to learn.

Year 3 parents should wait at the bottom of the steps (on the KS2 playground) and Year 4 should wait near the emergency gates. This helps to keep the paths free for parents with prams and pushchairs.
