Please do not send your child to school with any symptoms.



IMPORTANT THINGS TO NOTE with regard to DfE Guidance:

DfE Guidance for schools: "They (schools) should also consider the potential risks inherent in broader social mixing outside school and communicate with pupils about not socialising with each other in groups outside school.

If it is customary for parents to gather in the playground or to enter the buildings to drop off or collect children this should no longer be allowed, and neither should any gathering at the school gates to talk to other parents. Parents should come into school buildings only when strictly necessary and by appointment.




Jack had a go at the 'impossible shapes' art lesson actually set for Year 2 but Mr Harper thought they could have a go!
