Bushey Singing Festival - Friday 9th May

Dear Parents,

I'm delighted to inform you that Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 will be taking part in the inaugural Bushey Singing Festival, hosted by Little Reddings on Friday 9th May.

The festival will begin at 09:15 and conclude at 11:30. As such, children will need to be dropped off at **Little Reddings Primary School on Reddings Avenue (WD23 3PR)** at 09:00, where Hartsbourne staff from all three classes will be waiting to meet them. Once the festival is finished, Mr Bidewell and myself will drive the children back to Hartsbourne via minibuses in time for lunch.

Any children that attend Breakfast Club will be transported to Little Reddings by myself via the school minibus.

As we will be back at school for lunch, there is no need for children to have alternative arrangements regarding whether they are having a packed lunch or school dinner. However, please be mindful of the fact that the children will need to carry their own belongings on the way back to school, and ensure that all items are clearly named to prevent anything getting lost.

Unfortunately, we have been informed that parents will not be able to stay and watch the festival, due to it being the first year that it takes place and the high number of children attending. Providing all goes well, ticketing an event such as this may be possible in future years.

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ATTENDANCE MATTERS


Did you know that 90% of young people with attendance rates below 85% fail to achieve five or more good grades of GCSE and around one third achieve no GCSEs at all?
By teaching our children about the importance of school attendance and punctuality at this young age we are setting them up for future success. It is much harder to get a teenager out of bed and into school on time when this hasn't been given priority in their formative years.

We are very fortunate that so many of our families enforce this message at home. Our children come to school regularly, they arrive on time, they are well rested, and ready to learn. We also appreciate how frustrating getting everyone up and out can be in the morning, and so if you would like our support please let us know. We do run attendance intervention programs with the children, with the aim of encouraging them to take responsibility for their own organisation and time management. We've seen great success across all year groups and are more than happy to help so please feel free to ask

Year 2 – Sufiya and Florence are both wonderful learning partners who listen to others and accept challenges to their ideas.


Year 3 – Nathan and Jose Carlos are always great team members and work well no matter who they are grouped together with.
