A Note from Mr Harper



Welcome back!

I can hardly believe that it's only been four days since the start of the second half of this increasingly cold and damp Autumn term! It's fair to say that the children returned in excellent spirits and have dived straight back into their lessons with gusto! Whilst it's always a significant gear change going from holidays to term time (what on earth is that alarm sound I can hear at 06:00?!), it's always heart-warming to see how happy the children are to see us (to some extent) and each other (to a much larger extent!) Their smiles and enthusiastic stories about all the wonderful things you all get up to during the half-term holiday are infectious, and certainly help to blow away the cobwebs from bleary-eyed staff members!

That atmosphere on the first day back after a break always reminds me of one of the first conversations I ever had with our previous headteacher, Mrs Harte. Having worked in a few schools in areas of high deprivation, she was awash with ideas about how to make school a place that children were excited to come to, rather than somewhere they wanted to avoid. Of course some of her ideas came to fruition, but I did also have to explain to her that, on the whole, Hartsbourne children love coming to school! I know that there are days when they might have trouble getting over the threshold of the classroom door, and others when the threshold of the *bedroom* door might prove a challenge (!), but I've always been very proud of how enthusiastic our children are for all things Hartsbourne.

On the subject of feeling proud, I've spent a lot of time with Year 4 this week, firstly taking them for their swimming lesson on Tuesday and then shuttling them to their Moat Mount residential trip on Thursday. Given that it was the group's first swimming lesson with school, I might have expected some trepidation, but under the expert guidance of Mrs Mushtaq they filed in, changed quickly, sat patiently waiting for their session to start and then hopped straight into the pool to complete their initial assessment without a hint of anxiety. Being away from home for a night will always cause anxiety amongst children of all ages, but I couldn't fail to notice how happy, eager and excited the children were to clamber aboard the minibus, buckle themselves in (buried beneath suitcases and sleeping bags!) and emerge the other side, bright-eyed and smiley as they followed Miss Picton-Block into the Moat Mount centre. They had a wonderful time, expertly supported by Miss Picton-Block, Miss Allen and Mrs Somaiya, and I felt very proud of how willingly they threw themselves into an anxious situation. Flu Vaccinations 18th November

Please find attached the E-consent letter for your child's Flu vaccination for this coming winter. Please note that you can consent for either the **Flu nasal spray, OR the non-gelatine IM Flu vaccine.** Please make sure you complete the form online as soon as you can. The portal will close 48 hours ahead of the Flu session.

Vaccination UK East Anglia Immunisation (schoolvaccination.uk)

Flu can be very unpleasant for children and can sometimes cause serious problems, such as pneumonia. Children can catch and spread flu easily. Vaccinating them also helps protect others who are at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu, such as babies and older people.

The School Immunisation team will be coming into the school to deliver the vaccine. Please be aware that children can NOT receive this vaccination with their GP unless they are clinically vulnerable.

Year 6 – Ruby has maintained her focus throughout the week and Jessica always demonstrates excellent listening skills with her peers and adults within the classroom.


