New guidelines for attendance have been released by the Department for Education. You can find further information below. We have calculated that had the new rules been in place this year, Hertfordshire would have issued £4960 worth of fines to Hartsbourne parents, raising to £9920 if not paid within 21 days. We have termly meetings with our attendance officer and are held accountable for school attendance. This money does not benefit the

school in anyway and goes directly to Hertfordshire. We are not allowed to authorise any holidays during term time. Please help us to improve our attendance and prioritise your child's time at school.

As we come to the end of term we will be saying goodbye to Mr Smurthwaite and Mr Bidewell. We will miss them but I am sure they will keep us up to date with their escapades! Mr Bidewell has also volunteered to continue his coaching role for our football team. We will be welcoming some new staff to our nursery team. 

Penalty Notice Fines for School Attendance are changing!



With the introduction of the new Department of Education (DfE) National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into force for Penalty Notice Fines issued after 19th August 2024.

Per Parent, Per Child

Penalty Notice Fines are issued to each parent, for each child that was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave, would result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

Parent refers to anyone with parental responsibility and may include carers, step-parents, grandparents or any other adult with parental responsibility.

National Threshold

There will be a single consistent national threshold for when a penalty notice **must** be considered by all schools in England of 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 school days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10 school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span different terms or school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave of absence or unauthorised absence the amount will be:

- £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days
- Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days


Second Offence (within 3 years)

The Second time a Penalty Notice is issued for unauthorised absence the amount will be:
£160 per parent, per child within 28 days

Third Offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)


The third time an offence is committed a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrate's Court.

- Prosecution can result in criminal records and fines up to £2.500
- Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to 'failure to safeguard a child's education'



Hello Everyone,

As we approach the summer holidays, I thought I would remind you that the library is always here for you and your family! We have lots of activities across the summer as well as our usual books and magazines. For up to date information on our services and our opening hours you can always find us at: www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/libraries

Here are a few suggestions that I think might interest you:



The Summer Reading Challenge started on Saturday 6th July and runs throughout the holidays until Saturday 7th September. This is a fun, free activity that children of all ages can enjoy. We are challenging children to read 6 library books during the summer and in return we

will give them rewards. Anyone who reads all 6 books will be given a certificate and special medal.



We have hundreds of eBooks and Audiobooks available to download. There are loads of children's titles for all ages available through our supplier BorrowBox. You will need to use your Library Card number and PIN to log in for these. To get started, have a look at our website here: www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/ebooks



If you want a specific book, then you can always place a reservation via our online catalogue or the library app, and we will let you know when the book is ready to collect. This is particularly useful for school reading lists, as it saves a wasted trip to the library when everyone else in your class is wanting the same book! Have a look at our catalogue at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/libraries and select "Find a Book".

Children's reservations are free but there is a small charge for reservations made on adult cards so do make sure to place any child reservations on a child card!



If you need to do some research for a home school project, you can access Britannica Online through our website. You will just need your library card number to log in. Go to https://bit.ly/2X9M3mN and select Britannica Online. It is available in three levels: Junior (for age 6-10), Student (for age 10-15) and Adult (for age 15+), so it's perfect for all the family.



Access Hertfordshire Libraries from your phone or tablet by downloading the library app. Manage your account, search the catalogue, renew and reserve books. You can even have all of the family cards linked to the app, which makes managing your accounts super easy! Just search for "Hertfordshire Libraries" on your usual app provider.



Join us on Wednesday 21st August at 1.30pm for a free Family Nature Walk. We will share some stories and rhymes and hunt for some bugs along the way! The walk will start and finish at the library and the route will be suitable for buggies. No need to book, just come along and join us.

You can renew your books via the library app, on our website at www.Hertfordshire.gov.uk/libraries or by phone on 0300 123 4049. As ever, you can return any books you have finished with by bringing them in during our opening hours or by popping them through our letterbox if we are closed for us to return for you when we are next open.

There's loads more on offer via our website at www.hertfordshire.gov.uk/libraries so do have a look. If you are not already a library member, then you can sign up by filling in a quick form and showing us proof of address at the library to enjoy the membership straight away.

I hope this gives you a few ideas of the things we have going on in the library and offers to help your family keep reading.
