Reception - Reveley Lodge

On Tuesday 24th June, Year 4 will be visitng St Alban's Cathedral to take part in the Shine a Light Concert with Electric Umbrella and other Year 4 classes from Hertfordshire schools.

Electric Umbrella is an inspiring organisation that creates amazing, live, interactive music experiences with people with learning disabilities.

Year 4 will be part of Electric Umbrella's Super Group in the Nave of the Cathedral raising their voices together to shine a light on inclusion, celebrate differences and spread smiles.

This event is open to Year 4 students from mainstream schools and SEND learners of all ages, "Shine a Light" will bring together young people from across Hertfordshire and beyond to sing and make music together, fostering integration, unity, and creativity.

The children will be leaving from school at 9:00am and will arrive back at school at 12:30pm in time for their lunch. They will be travelling to and from the Cathedral by coach. The children should wear school uniform.
