Year 3 - Science Quality Mark

We have been selected by the Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) to be a trial school for the Primary Science Quality Mark. This is a 2 year project which will provide us with training and resources to further improve our Science curriculum. The trial will be tracking Year 3 responses over the next 2 years and comparing them to schools who are not in the trial. This is a very exciting opportunity for us to be involved in a national study. Dear Parents and Carers,

Secondary School Experience Week 17th – 21st June

We are incredibly excited to be offering your child a wonderful opportunity to experience life at a secondary school for the entire week; beginning 17th June 2024. This is one of the amazing benefits of having schools that work alongside one another in the Bushey St. James Trust.

The secondary school experience will take place at Bushey Meads School. **Your child will be expected to arrive at Bushey Meads via the main entrance on Coldharbour Lane at 8.30 am** for an 8.40 am start. Members of Bushey Meads School staff and some Student Leaders along with Mr Willimott will be on hand to show the Year 6 pupils where to go.

They will follow a timetabled five lesson day, indulging in a variety of subjects such as Humanities, Technology, Performing Arts, P.E. and English, Maths and Science. **Please pack their P.E. kits for Monday as they are timetabled for P.E. on this day.**

Mr Willimott and Ms Roux will be remaining with the classes for the whole week so that the students see a familiar face at the school. Students will be eating lunch in the Bushey Meads School restaurant each day where they will have their own packed lunch.

At the end of the day you will be able to collect your child from the main entrance of Bushey Meads School at 3.05 pm.

On Friday 23rd June, you are invited to arrive at Bushey Meads School at 2.15 pm, in order to see a presentation from your child in the Main Hall, showcasing some of the work they will have produced during the week. This event will also include a special performance by the Year 6 pupils.

Transitioning from primary to secondary school is an eventful process and each child experiences this in their own way. We hope that spending the week at Bushey Meads will alleviate any worries that he or she might have, regardless of the secondary school that they will be attending.
