ATTENDANCE MATTERS

THE HIDDEN COST OF TERM TIME HOLIDAYS



Before I started working in a school I definitely wasn't aware of the huge impact on children when they have time off during term time, but over the years I've seen how it affects friendships and self esteem, as well as causing gaps in children's learning. From the outside it's easy to think that a couple of days here and there won't matter too much but you'd be surprised how quickly it all adds up

Absences and Anxiety

When a child is absent from school for any amount of time, it can cause feelings of anxiety. They are aware that they'll have missed out on learning which is hard to catch back up, but also friendship dynamics change extremely quickly at primary school age and children often struggle to fit back in on their return. We definitely see a higher number of friendship issues in classes with a lower attendance percentage, than we do in others where the children have had the opportunity to learn to resolve issues for themselves in school on a regular basis.

SEND or Missed Learning?

One of the first things external agencies will look at when a query is raised around SEND needs and support is has the child had the opportunity to make the same progress as their peers. If a child has not been in school regularly then is their lack of attainment simply due to not being in lessons when they are supposed to? In order for us to support all of our children to the best of our ability they need to be in school and ready to learn at the right time. These steps will give your child the best possible chance of making progress and getting the support they need if additional intervention is required.

Missing school means missing out.

Regular attendance and punctuality is paramount to our children reaching their full potential and making the most of the educational opportunities which Hartsbourne offers them.

Flu Vaccinations 5th November

Please find attached the E-consent letter for your child's Flu vaccination for this coming winter. Please note that you can consent for either the **Flu nasal spray**, **OR the non-gelatine IM Flu vaccine**. Please make sure you complete the form online as soon as you can. The portal will close 48 hours ahead of the Flu session.

Vaccination UK East Anglia Immunisation (schoolvaccination.uk)

Flu can be very unpleasant for children and can sometimes cause serious problems, such as pneumonia. Children can catch and spread flu easily. Vaccinating them also helps protect others who are at higher risk of getting seriously ill from flu, such as babies and older people.

The School Immunisation team will be coming into the school to deliver the vaccine. Please be aware that children can NOT receive this vaccination with their GP unless they are clinically vulnerable.

Poppy Appeal


Tuesday 5th November - Monday 11th November

Year 6 – Nathan has shown responsibility and independence in all his work and Josh R has shown on several occasions this week his ability to solve problems he is struggling with in class.



Class Specific Messages



Year 4 - Swimming

In Autumn Term, Year 4 will have swimming lessons on Tuesday afternoons. The class is split into two groups with half having lessons before half term and the other half after half term. Girls are required to wear a one-piece swimming costume (i.e. not a bikini) and boys are required to wear swimming trunks rather than long swimming shorts. Girls with long hair must wear this tied back and jewellery must not be worn in the pool.

In order to cover costs for the minibus we do have to ask for a £5 voluntary contribution. This option has now been added to Arbor for the **second group of children**.

Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 - The Gruffalo

This is just a quick reminder that the deadline for making your payments for this trip is **Monday.** In line with school policy we may have to cancel this trip if we do not receive enough contributions.

Year 3 - The Natural History Museum

On the 27th November Year 3 will be visiting The Natural History Museum as part of their geography topic, earthquakes and volcanoes. Your child will need to wear usual school uniform for this visit and bring a packed lunch and a still drink (No cans or fizzy drinks) in a named recyclable or reusable bag.
