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Before and After School:

Help us to keep your children safe



The beginning and end of day are always extremely busy for teachers and so in order to keep your children as safe as possible here is a reminder of our processes.

Before School

- In the morning please ensure you stay with your child until they are safely in the school building, and in the case of Breakfast Club, are signed in with a member of staff. Year 6 children can wait by themselves in the morning, however if they are not acting responsibly then we will have to request that parents stay with them.
- Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 Please let the class teacher or Breakfast Club staff know if
 there is a change to your usual pick up arrangements for that day. We do receive a high
 number of requests during the school day about changes to pick up which can easily lead
 to mistakes, delays and frustrations at the door for everyone. In order to make sure
 children can be handed to parents safely and quickly please ensure that on the day
 changes are in the case of an emergency only.
- In order to ensure the best possible start for your children, please remember to keep the classroom doorway clear. If you have something that you feel the teacher should be aware of please send a quick email to **parents@hartsbourne.org.uk** and the information will be passed on. This way they are able to focus on greeting, settling the children, and record any changes in pick up.

After School

- Reception Year 5 children must be collected from outside their classroom door. Please note we are unable to release children to anyone under the age of 16 which includes allowing children to walk to sibling's classrooms.
- Year 6 children are free to walk up to the school gates to meet their parents but should be told to come back to the school office if they can not find you. They are also able to make their own way home provided you have given consent. Children who are travelling home independently are also allowed to bring a mobile phone into school, which must be handed to the class teacher in the morning.
- If you wish to catch the class teacher at the end of the day then please bear with them whilst they ensure all other children are collected safely first.

Children are not permitted to use the playground equipment neither before nor after school. It is extremely tempting to play but it has been the cause of many accidents sadly, and so we do kindly ask that you keep your children with you to prevent these from happening.




Continuing from previous years success, we are once again celebrating the NSPCC number day at Hartsbourne!


We will be having a fun day of Maths activities, teacher swaps and our yearly House Maths competition, all while raising money for the NSPCC.

Year 6 – Aimee sees every moment as an opportunity to learn new skills and Mason is always calm modelling these skills to children in younger year groups.


