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
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A New Roof for Hartsbourne!








Community Governor Vacancy

Year 4 – Kamile is always a positive and kind learning partner to everyone and Jesse has shown great discussion skills in RE this week.


Year 5 – Year 5 have all worked extremely hard on their puppet performances and have shown great teamwork skills by helping and supporting each other!
