Reminder of the Site Rules



All schools have a duty of care to their children and as a result we do have to have in place rules that we ask Parents and Carers to follow when on and around the school grounds. We do not put these in place to be difficult, and you may not personally understand the 'why', but we do ask for your respect and support.

- Dogs -Only assistance dogs and dogs being used for educational purposes are allowed onto the school premises, and then only if agreed to by the Head Teacher. This includes when dropping off and picking up from clubs outside of standard school hours. They should also never be left unattended and tide up to the school gates/railings.
- Vaping and Smoking This is NOT permitted on the school grounds at ANY TIME.
- Playground Equipment Children (and adults) are not permitted to use the equipment on the playground neither before nor after school. If a child has an accident as a result of being on there unsupervised by school staff it can have serious consequences that you may not be aware of as parents/carers.

Absences for Religious Observance

Thank you so much to all of those parents who have emailed in already to confirm that their children will be absent for Rosh Hashanah. If your child is going to be absent from school due to Religious Observance, please let us know as soon as practicably possible via email. This will of course be an authorised absence provided the day is exclusively set apart for religious observance by the religious body to which you belong, but please be aware it does still affect their attendance percentage.



Illnesses and Medication in school

It is definitely cough, cold, and random virus season, and so we thought it would be handy to send out a quick reminder of our processes in school.

We follow the NHS guidance when it comes to common illnesses and a handy point of reference is the NHS information page, <u>Is my child too ill for school?</u>

In order to be consistent we will generally only contact a parent to collect a child if they have **vomited**, have **diarrhoea** or have recorded a **high temperature** when checked in school. The exception to this is when there's not long left of the school day, and at this point we may just let the parent know at the door.

If your child has been prescribed medication that needs to be taken during the school day, for example antibiotics that are to be taken 4 times a day, then please complete the online form which can be found **here** on the school website.

We know it can be challenging in the mornings when they've got a cold, feeling a bit bunged up and out of sorts, but we really do see a lot of children perk up once they're here and surrounded by their friends \mathfrak{C} .


