PSHE

Health and wellbeing. Playing nicely, keeping safe

Children will look at what they have in common with others and how they are different. How to be fair and play fair and being independent. We will also look at how the children can keep themselves safe, concentrating on medicines, hygiene and e-safety. How you can help: question your child on various strategies they have learned in school and how they can be helpful.

<u>History</u>

My Family History

Begin to use a timeline and place events in chronological order. Use primary and secondary sources to conduct research of the past.

How you can help: encourage discussion and research of the past.

<u>PE</u>

Dance: Explore basic body actions through the theme of Marvellous Me.

Gymnastics:children investigate movement,stillness and how to find and use space safely. They explore basic gymnastic actions on the floor and using apparatus.

Games:chldren to develop basic game playing skills,focussing on throwing and catching.

How you can help: encourage your child to practice their skills at home.

To recognise how people are thankful for the earth's resources.

How you can help: encourage your children to further their understanding of religious festivals.

Year 1– Autumn Term

<u>Music</u>

Compose and Perform

Children will learn to perform songs related to our under the sea theme using actions.

Identify and create long and short sounds using their voices and instruments

How you can help: encourage your children to develop their musical tastes at home (within reason!)

Painting-Impressionism

Children will explore the art of impressionists such as Monet.

Use the skills of impressionist artists to create their own piece of impressionist art.

Look at the movement of the Earth and Moon.

Looking at how we keep safe when using the internet. Use a word processor to label and classify objects and to assemble text held in a word bank.

To use digital tools to generate images and sounds

How you can help: encourage children to practice their newly learned techniques at home.

Design Technology

Joining Materials-Puppets

The children will investigate a range of puppets and how they are made. They will then use skills taught to create their own puppets.

Using basic materials
