Individual/Group reading, fiction, non-fiction texts and related understanding, phonic skills (Letters and Sounds)

Fiction and Poetry:

Stories reflecting children's own experiences.

Book Week

Reading, reciting, creating and performing poetry.

Exploring free verse and rhyming couplets

Non-Fiction:

Recounts

Instructions

Weekly spellings to learn related to high frequency words and phonic skills

Handwriting skills-letter formation, orientation etc

How you can help: provide opportunities for writing and reading at home.

PSHE

Relationships (Road safety)

The children will learn how to cross road with adult. How to communicating feelings, who to tell (identify special people) and how to keep surprises not secrets

How you can help: Encourage your child to be independent and discuss how they are feeling.

History

The History of Flight

Look at the chronology of flight and its importance to the local area.

Use primary and secondary sources to conduct research of the past.

How you can help: encourage discussion and research of the past, eg use the local library.

PE

Dance: Children will explore basic body actions.

Gymnastics: children investigate movement, stillness and how to find and use space safely. They explore basic gymnastic actions on the floor and using apparatus.

Games: children to develop basic game playing skills, focussing on throwing and catching.

How you can help: Be a role model for your child to be healthy and active.

Year 1-consolidated/extended as appropriate

Properties of numbers, place value, sequences and problem solving.

Year 1– Spring Term

Music

Transcribe

Children will learn about symbols used in music. They will use these symbols to represent a composition and to help with a performance.

How you can help: provide opportunities for your children to develop their musical tastes.

Art and Design

Printing

Exploring work from artists such as Monet and Mary Cassatt to look at abstract and geometric printing.

Learn about the technique of printing and use the skills to create their own printed picture.

How you can help: provide opportunities for your child to develop artistic skills at home.

Science

Everyday Materials

Identify the properties of everyday materials.

Characteristics and uses of common materials.

Describing and comparing materials.

Seasonal Changes- (winter and spring)

Observe plant changes associated with the four seasons.

How you can help: discuss and investigate at home; eg identify changes in plants and trees at the park or in the garden.

ICT

Discovering Programming

Understand that digital devices operate using programs.

Understand algorithms are a set of precise instructions and begin to create some for everyday tasks.

How you can help: Provide opportunities for practise and discuss e-safety.

Design Technology

Vehicles

The children will investigate a range of levers, wheels and winding mechanisms. They will then use skills taught to create their own vehicle.

Use materials to practise drilling, screwing, gluing and nailing materials to make and strengthen products
Planning and making a vehicle.

How you can help: help your child choose the materials they require to create their vehicle and bring in to school.

Geography

Local Area

Children will use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of the school and the key human and physical features of its surrounding environment. Also identify the land use around our school.

How you can help: discuss the physical and human features in the local area, look at maps.
