# **VISION**

Hartsbourne Primary School is an inclusive learning community where we are:

Building a strong school **community**; inspiring pupils to gain the **confidence**, resilience and independence to become **life-long learners**, making the best **progress** possible and creating happy memories.

'Prevent' is best summarised as follows from the report by Lord Carlile:

"...at the root of this Prevent strategy is the basic assertion that extremism breeds terrorism; and that extremism is the vocal or active opposition to fundamental British values, including democracy, the rule of law, individual liberty and mutual respect and tolerance of different faiths and beliefs."

## The Government's Prevent Strategy

Prevent is a government strategy designed to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorist or extremist causes. Prevent covers all types of terrorism and extremism, including the extreme right wing, violent Islamist groups and other causes. All schools (as well as other organisations) have a duty to safeguard children from radicalisation and extremism. This means we have a responsibility to protect children from extremist and violent views the same way we protect them from drugs or gang violence. Importantly, we can also provide a safe place for pupils to discuss these issues, so they better understand how to protect themselves.

### WHAT WE DO AT HARTSBOURNE

Many of the things we already do help our children to become positive, happy members of society and contribute to the 'Prevent' strategy. For instance, all children are involved in making class rules, school council and House Captains. Part of our system of behavioural consequences involves children reflecting on their actions and discussing these with teachers. Other strategies:

- Finding out about other religions, exploring other cultures, celebrating festivals.
- Challenging prejudices and racist comments, promoting diversity.
- Develop critical thinking skills and a positive self-identify.
- Promoting British Values (democracy, the rule of law, liberty, respect, tolerance and inclusion).
- Promoting the spiritual, moral, social and cultural development of pupils through assemblies, RE and PSHE lessons, themed weeks, visitors and enrichment opportunities.

The Prevent strategy is not just about discussing extremism, which may not be appropriate for younger children. It is about teaching children the values of tolerance and mutual respect and how to keep themselves safe in the wider world. Teachers will always make sure any discussions are suitable for the age and maturity of the children.

Extremism can take many forms, including political, religious and misogynistic extremism. Some of these may or may not be a bigger threat in our area but technology knows no boundaries and information is freely available in our society. Our aim is to give the children the skills to protect themselves from any extremist views they may encounter, now or later in their lives. Further information at:
