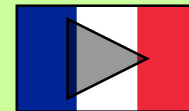
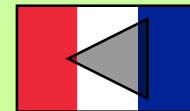


Note how the spelling changes based on the gender of the respondent.

Again, notice the different spelling when talking in plural.

The same applies when talking about sisters, as well as some other changes.

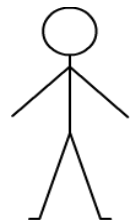
