

1. There used to be a lake and a town called Green Lake, but now both have gone.
2. One mark for an attitude below and a second mark for related evidence:

Attitude	Evidence
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It's very hot 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> "temperature hovers around ninety-five degrees" "if you can find any shade"
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It's a dangerous place 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reference to rattlesnakes, scorpions and yellow-spotted lizards. Reference to the possibility of death.
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> It's boring 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Reference to campers deliberately trying to be bitten so they don't have dig a hole.

3. One mark acknowledging that the warden is **selfish** or **greedy**, and a second mark for the evidence that **his hammock is forbidden** or that **he is the only one who gets the shade**.
4. One mark for the answer **no**, and a second for the evidence that campers **deliberately try to be bitten so they don't have dig a hole**.
5. One mark for any of the following:
 - a. Doesn't explain what the holes are for (so you want to find out)
 - b. Use of the word 'usually' hints that Stanley will have a run-in with the creatures
 - c. Introduces the setting but doesn't yet start the main plot-line
 - d. Any other answer that refers to the text and the reader wanting to find out more
6. One mark for saying **yes** or **no** and a second mark for explaining why (based on your own opinion rather than text-based evidence).
